## (HISTORY)

AIM: Majors will demonstrate in their essays knowledge of ideas and theories from influential historical philosophers, and will be able to bring those ideas and theories to bear on philosophical questions.

METHOD: Each term, the general performance of majors in a relevant course will be assessed according to our assessment rubric. Relevant courses: PHIL 3100, 3110, 3120, 3150, or 3180. Also, instructors' performance on IDEA objective 2 is relevant.

Scores of majors enrolled in PHIL 3100: 4, 3, 2, 2, 2, 4, 2.

Average = 2.7 = "The student demonstrates knowledge of ideas and theories from influential historical philosophers, and brings those ideas and theories to bear on philosophical questions."

## (CREATIVITY)

AIM: Majors will be able to raise thoughtful and interesting questions and objections that further and enrich philosophical discussions, both orally and in writing.

METHOD: Each term, the general performance of majors in a relevant course will be assessed according to our assessment rubric. Relevant courses: our upper-division courses, and especially PHIL 4900 (Special Topics) and 4910 (Readings and Research). Also, instructors' performance on IDEA objectives 11 and 12 are relevant.

Scores of majors enrolled in PHIL 4250: 3, 3, 4, 4.

Average = 3.5 = "The student raises exceptionally thoughtful and interesting questions and objections that further and enrich philosophical discussions."
