## (CREATIVITY)

AIM: Majors will be able to raise thoughtful and interesting questions and objections that further and enrich philosophical discussions, both orally and in writing.

METHOD: Each term, the general performance of majors in a relevant course will be assessed according to our assessment rubric. Relevant courses: our upper-division courses, and especially PHIL 4900 (Special Topics) and 4910 (Readings and Research). Also, instructors' performance on IDEA objectives 11 and 12 are relevant.
