Description:

The Scholar of the Year Award is given each year to recognize and encourage excellence in scholarship and/or creative activities. Service and student activity involvement may also be considered in the selection process, but the main emphasis is on scholarly achievement. Nominees must be on schedule to receive a bachelor's degree at this year's commencement ceremony (meaning they completed their bachelor's degree the previous summer, fall or current spring).

Criteria:

Nominees must demonstrate outstanding academic success and show evidence of scholarly activities such as:

- Completion of undergraduate research, participation as a writing fellow, teaching assistant, UTF, research assistant, SI leader. Presentations at professional conferences. Completion of a senior project or thesis.

A one page, double spaced, nomination letter with an explanation as to why they are being nominated.

Due Date:

Nominations are due to the Humanities and Social Sciences Dean's Office by December 15.

Recognition:

Recognized at the College Awards Ceremony. Portfolio for the winner is due to the Provost Office the end of January for university-wide consideration.
